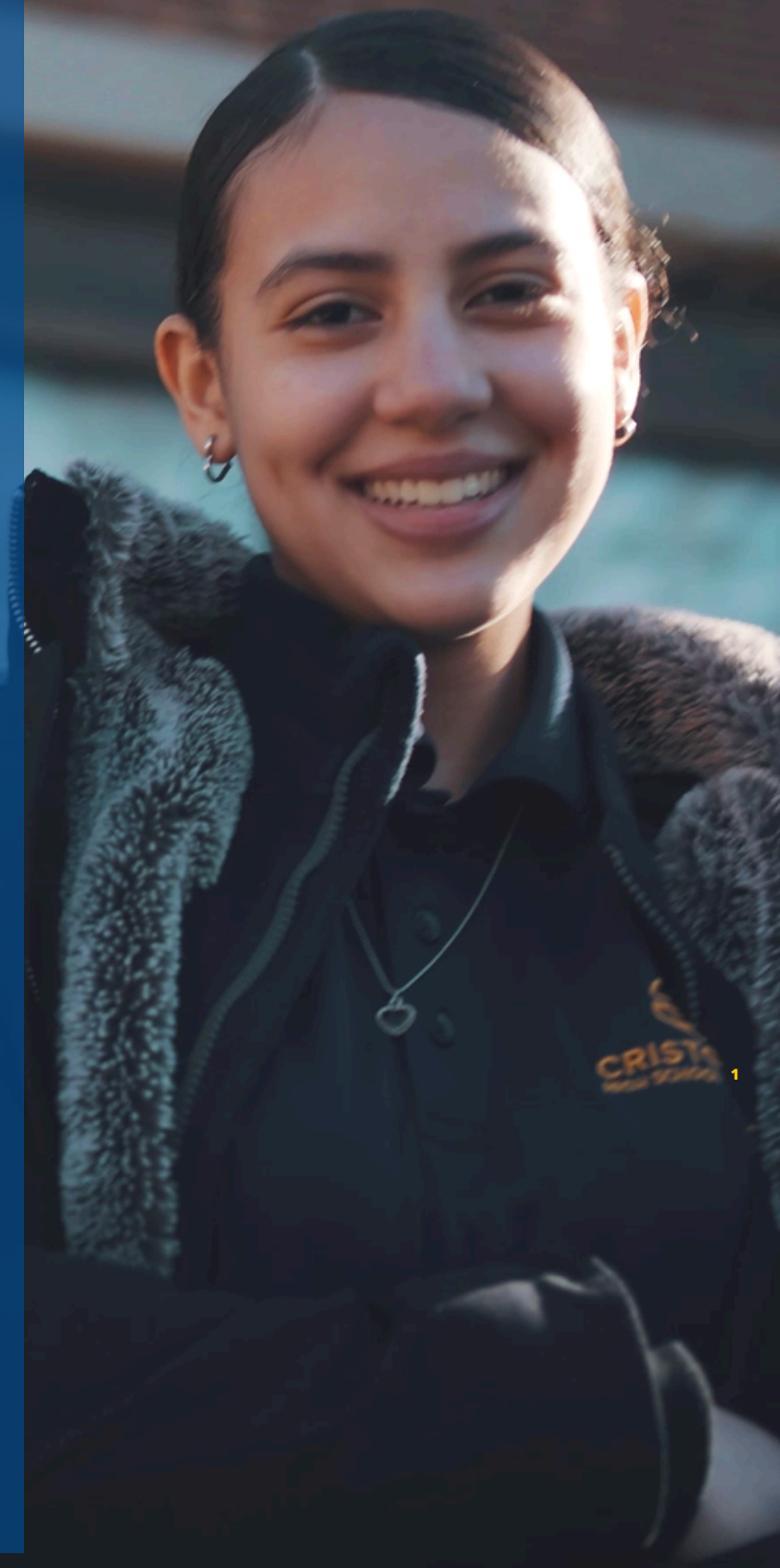

A LETTER FROM THE PRESIDENT

Dear Friends,

Years ago, I read the book *A Sense of Urgency* by John P. Kotter. I was struck by his premise that organizational change happens only when urgency is present. It was my guiding motto throughout the last few school years, as we wrestled with the immense challenges brought on by the global pandemic.

Cristo Rey Boston students and students in comparable socio-economic brackets enter high school with considerable educational deficits. The pandemic put larger pressure on our need to close those learning gaps and ensure our students were prepared to succeed in college. As I noted in the 2022 Academic Signing Day video, "We only have four years, these students don't have a minute to waste." Fortunately, there were others who shared my sense of urgency.

It has been part of our long-range planning process to expand programming to meet the students' spiritual, educational, financial, and nutritional needs. The impact of the pandemic made the need to act more urgent. Last year, we launched three exciting initiatives thanks to essential partnerships.

- Ed Murphy, a long-term member of the Board of Trustees, and his wife Jennifer announced a \$1 million gift to Cristo Rey Boston. This is largest gift in school history and it explicitly supports faculty salaries, bolstering the retention of innovative and engaged educators in all disciplines. Given the disruption in student learning, the need to retain talented teachers who have strong student relationships cannot be overstated.
- Many families rely on in-school breakfast and lunch to mitigate food insecurity for their children. The pandemic disrupted the pipeline of food, and schools across the city scrambled to fill the gap. In partnership with the Shah Family Foundation, Soulful Cuisine Catering, and Stock Pot Malden, we now provide breakfast and lunch options that are culturally appropriate, nutritionally balanced, and cooked on-site, encouraging students to eat a more balanced diet.
- A thriving partnership with the Boston College Connell School of Nursing born in the height of the pandemic continued, enabling Cristo Rey Boston students to access much-needed healthcare while giving BC Nurse Practitioner students valuable clinical experience. Scoliosis assessments, eye exams, and routine checkups were available. The BC Nurses offered Immunization clinics allowing students to update many lapsed vaccines and receive COVID-19 vaccines.

These are important initiatives, and they foreshadow the improvements we continue to make to the curriculum, staffing, and spiritual needs of our students.

I aim to make Cristo Rey Boston THE school of choice for students from under-resourced communities across Boston. We will do that by relentlessly addressing the needs of our students, helping them overcome the institutional bias that impedes their progress, and using our knowledge and expertise to help them achieve their goals.

Central to our mission are the students we serve. Cristo Rey Boston students are hard-working, aspirational, and yearning for a better life for themselves and their families. Families often have made tremendous sacrifices to give their children better opportunities.

We honor those sacrifices by keeping our promise to students and their families. Cristo Rey Boston will provide a tuition-free Catholic education that provides a rigorous college-prep curriculum, a valuable four-year work experience, and an inclusive community that believes each student is unique and capable of success. Our mission is to be the safe harbor where dreams turn into reality.

I invite you to embrace my sense of urgency. Visit the school, hire a student, and volunteer in the building. Collectively, we can meet our students' needs to support their success.

CELEBRATING KEY MILESTONES & PARTNERSHIPS

Expanded Health and Wellness Services

Our partnership with the Boston College Connell School of Nursing continues, enabling Cristo Rey Boston students to access much-needed healthcare while giving BC Nurse Practitioner students valuable clinical experience. In addition to scoliosis assessments, eye exams, and routine checkups, the BC Nurses offer immunization clinics allowing students to update many lapsed vaccines and receive COVID-19 vaccines.

Investments in Teacher Retention

Ed & Jennifer Murphy, recognizing the importance of teacher stability, committed \$1 million in 2021 to enable the retention of talented teachers. Their gift is the largest in the school's history.

Focus on Student Nutrition

In partnership with the Shah Family Foundation, Local Lunchbox, and StockPot Malden, in 2021, Cristo Rey Boston embarked on a program to employ local chefs to prepare nutritious, culturally appropriate meals that support student health.

Music to Our Ears

In 2021, Phill and Liz Gross made a multi-year \$300,000 commitment to incorporate music education at Cristo Rey Boston beginning in the 2022-23 school year. The new music program is now an academic subject and a signature choral program.

KRYSS DARGOUT, CLASS OF 2022: "I'M READY TO SUCCEED IN COLLEGE"

Arriving in the United States three years after the massive 2010 earthquake that devastated Haiti, Kryss Dargout recalls that her parents were laser focused on giving their children a brighter future.

As a middle school student at UP Academy Dorchester, her guidance counselor suggested looking at Cristo Rey Boston as a high school option. Her parents were initially hesitant, noting the tuition costs as a potential obstacle. However, Kryss felt certain that Cristo Rey would be a great fit. Kryss continued, "Catholics are well respected in Haiti, and ultimately, my mom decided she liked the idea of me attending a Catholic school." During the pandemic, when the school made the decision to be completely tuition free, Kryss shared that her parents were relieved.



Placed at SharkNinja during her senior year, Kryss enjoyed the mentorship of her supervisor and the variety of work she was asked to do. Working with the Director of Diversity, Equity & Inclusion, Kryss was asked to research, plan events, and look at ways for SharkNinja to give back to the community. She noted, "I appreciate the fact that the work I was doing impacts a lot of people."

Looking ahead, Kryss aspires to be an attorney. She continued, "One of the things I enjoyed about Cristo Rey Boston was the career exploration program they provide. This past year we had a lot of speakers who exposed us to different careers, which I found helpful. I love doing something different every day, and think being an attorney will allow me to help others as well. She continued, "I love being prepared, having the experience of working has prepared me for knowing about creating a career, and the importance of being responsible and contributing."

Kryss is ready for the next step at Emmanuel College. The thought of college, although daunting, is exciting. Kryss stated, "I am nervous because I do not really know what to expect. However, I have worked hard to move on to the next level, and believe I have the skills to succeed in college."

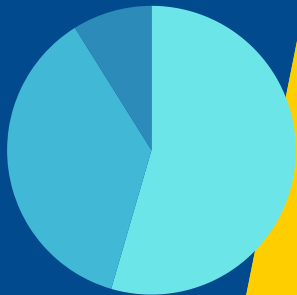

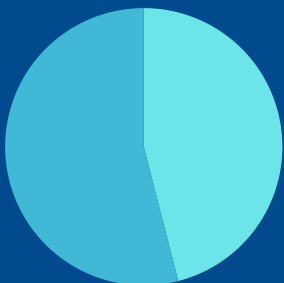

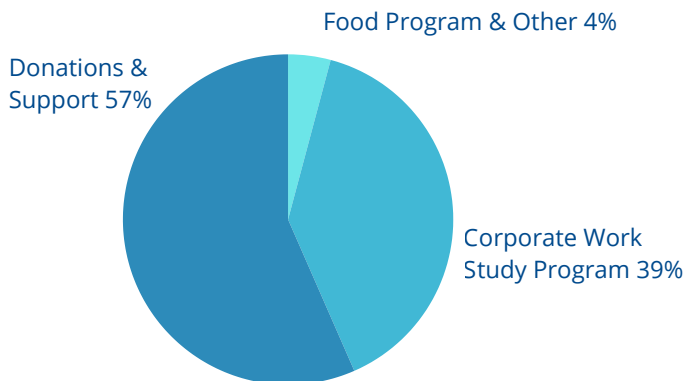

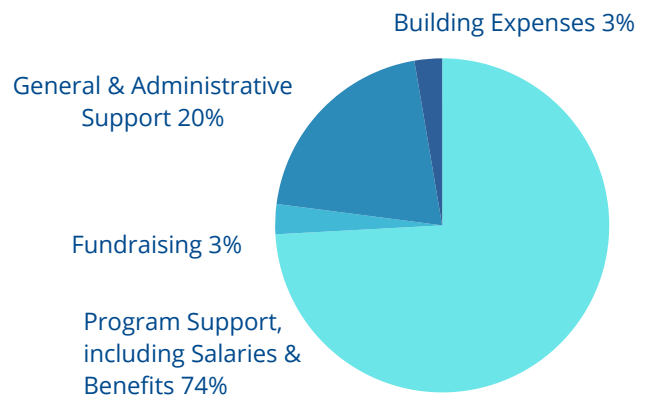
FY22 REVENUE
